ICE RESOURCES FOR ABORIGINAL AND TORRES STRAIT ISLANDER PEOPLE

Ice (crystal methamphetamine) is a growing problem for communities and people around Australia so it's important that Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people have access to culturally appropriate information resources and support services.

The Cracks in the Ice website provides you with up-to-date information about ice for people who are experiencing problems with ice, their friends and families, community groups, schools and health professionals. This includes resources you may find useful across three main areas:

1. **What is ice?** Key facts about ice, why people might use ice and laws relating to ice.
1. **What are the effects of ice?** Information about the physical and mental health effects of Ice and the risks associated with using Ice with other drugs.
2. **Staying safe.** Information on how you can access support and treatment services across Australia and tips for how you can help a loved one affected by Ice.

We will also be developing a new resource to improve access to culturally appropriate methamphetamine resources and support services for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.

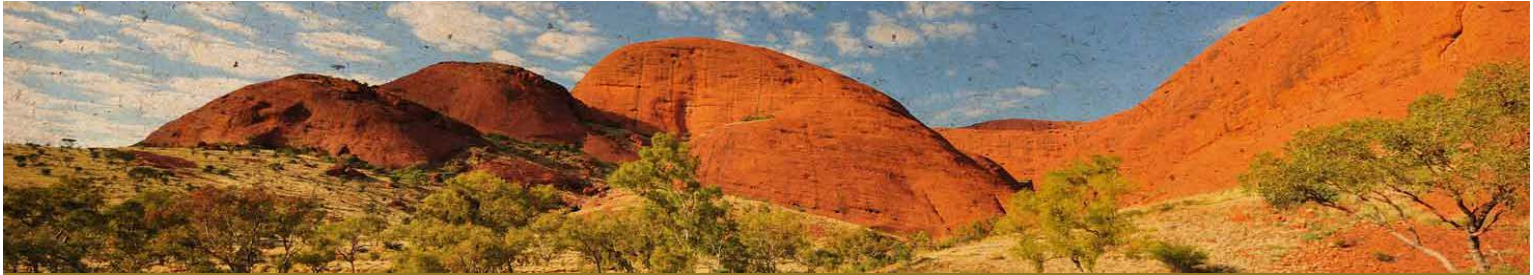
