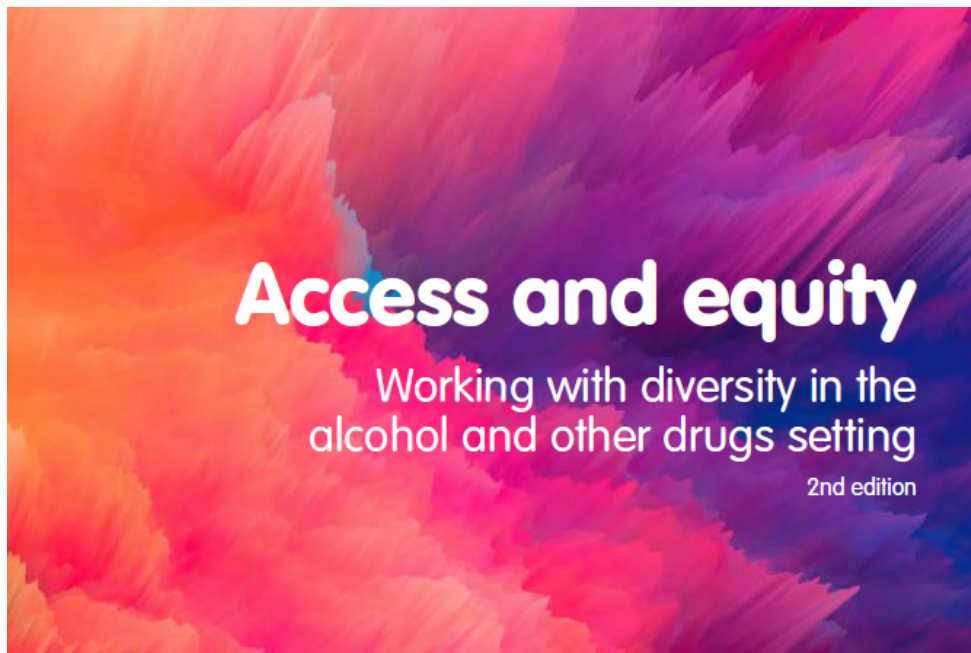


Working with Diversity in Alcohol & Other Drug Settings
