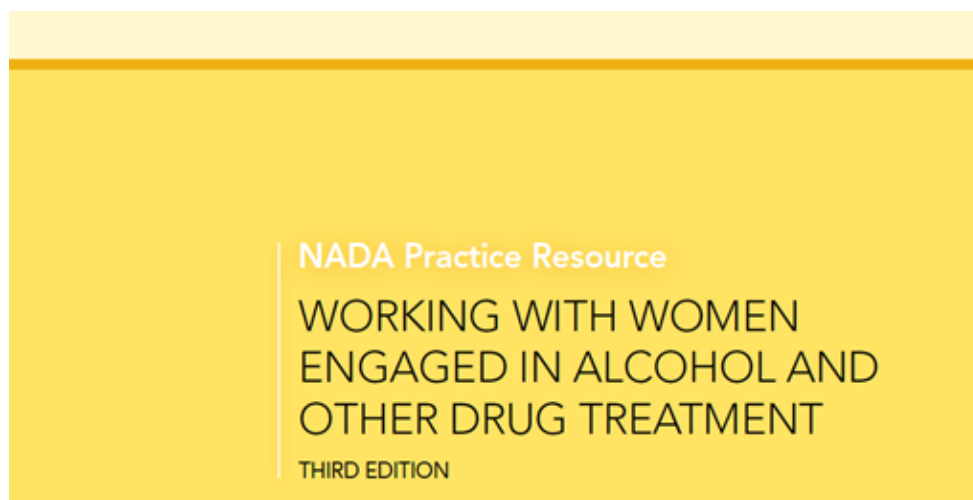


Working with women engaged in alcohol and other drug treatment
